



THE SWEDISH DACHSHUND CLUB ANNIVERSARY SHOW

The Swedish Dachshund Club is turning 125, and we are celebrating with an Anniversary Show. We are delighted that you want to take part—welcome!

In 1902, the Swedish Dachshund Club held its first show, which took place at Skansen. Reports from the show describe a cloudless sky, brilliant sunshine, and a showground filled with a lively crowd. We hope to be just as fortunate this weekend.

This year's show will be held in Ulriksdal Palace Park and is a side show to the *European Dog Show* (EDS). During the weekend, the palace park will be transformed into a showground where eight breed clubs will hold shows in up to 18 rings. In total, we expect more than 1,500 entries.

The dachshund show on 6 September is organised by the East Swedish Dachshund Club together with the Uppland Dachshund Club.

We extend a special welcome to our judges Carina Olsson, Lars Widén, and Bo Paulsson.

Information about start times, ring allocation, and judges for the finals will be announced after the entry deadline has passed (20 August).

Entry fee: SEK 350; puppy and veteran SEK 250.

- **Vaccination and ID checks** will be carried out continuously during the day through random checks. You are welcome to show your vaccination certificate at the secretariat.
- **Smoking is prohibited throughout the entire showground.**
- **Tent-free zones** are located around the ring; please respect these areas.

Parking

Parking is available in the designated area (see below). It is a short walk to the showground. The parking fee is SEK 50 and payment is made via Swish.

No cars are permitted in the palace park or by the showground. Accessible parking is available; to obtain permission, please contact the show manager.

Directions to parking at Ulriksdal:

Address: Slottsträdgårdsvägen 3, Solna (located on the left about 10 m before the entrance to the parking area) GPS: 59.3897628 18.0073760

From the E4 from the south:

Take the exit toward Ursvik, Järva krog, exit 169. Drive under the motorway and turn right toward Sörentorp. After Circle K, turn right onto Järvavägen. Follow Järvavägen for about 1.5 km. Turn right onto Slottsträdgårdsvägen. After about 100 metres, there is a signposted entrance on the right to the grass field; straight ahead you will see parked cars (GPS: 59.3897628 18.0073760).

From the E4 from the north:

Take the exit toward Silverdal (Kistamässan, Helenelund, Kista Science Center), drive toward Silverdal (over the motorway), then turn right onto Sollentunavägen. After the Police Academy, keep left onto Järvavägen and follow it for about 1 km. Turn left onto Slottsträdgårdsvägen. After about 100 metres, there is a signposted entrance on the right to the grass field; straight ahead you will see parked cars (GPS: 59.3897628 18.0073760).

Challenge trophies:

The following trophies will be competed for in the final competitions.

Please check whether your dog is eligible to compete for any challenge trophy.

Dualis Challenge Trophy for the BIS dog

The trophy shall be awarded to the BIS dog at the East Swedish Dachshund Club's annual show, beginning in 1997. In 2012, the trophy was renamed the Dualis Challenge Trophy.

The trophy shall circulate for at least 15 years. To win the trophy outright, the same dog owner must have obtained at least five awards with at least five different dogs. If no dog owner has obtained five awards after 15 years, the trophy shall continue to circulate until this occurs.

If, after 15 years, two or more dog owners have the same number of awards, the trophy shall continue to circulate.



Kennel Cairtib's Challenge Trophy

The trophy is awarded to the most beautiful long-haired junior or young dog of standard size, regardless of sex, that is awarded a CK at the show in question.

The trophy shall circulate for ten years and be awarded to the dog owner with the most awards, but at least three. If, after ten years, no dog owner has obtained three awards, the trophy shall continue to circulate until this occurs.

The donor has the right to compete for the trophy but may not win it outright.

The trophy was established for competition in connection with the East Swedish Dachshund Club's 40th anniversary in 1998 and was awarded for the first time at the club's autumn show.

The trophy was donated by Ulrika Eriksson and Conny Jansson, Kennel Cairtib, Haninge.



Uzza's Challenge Trophy

For the wire-haired miniature dachshund that is awarded BOS at the show.

No hunting merits are required. The trophy is won outright by the dog owner who has obtained three awards with two dogs.

The trophy was donated by Christina Berggren, Åkersberga, and was competed for for the first time at the autumn show in 1997.



Figaro's Memorial Trophy

The trophy is awarded to the best wire-haired dachshund, regardless of size, born to wire-haired parents, that at the show has received at least a first prize in quality class or the equivalent, and has previously obtained an approved den aptitude test or an equivalent merit in another country, for example a second prize in Norway or Denmark or C35 in Finland. The trophy is won outright by the dog owner who has won it three times with at least two different dogs, regardless of order.

The donor has the right to compete for the trophy but may not win it outright.

The trophy was established by Annika Rönning, Kennel Eiarö, in memory of IntNord JgCh Eiarö Figaro, to be awarded at the East Swedish Dachshund Club's summer show in 2000.



Rondodrevet's Challenge Trophy

For the most beautiful wire-haired dachshund at the show, regardless of size, that has won a first prize in a tracking trial and, at the show, has obtained at least a second prize in quality class.

The trophy is won outright by the dog owner who has obtained three awards with at least two different dogs.

The donor may compete for the trophy but may not win it outright.

The trophy was donated by Carina and Kent Andersson, Rondodrevet's Kennel, and was established for competition for the first time at the East Swedish Dachshund Club's autumn show in 2006.



Ardito's Lawrence Challenge Trophy

Awarded to the most beautiful smooth-haired veteran of standard size. The dog must be qualified to participate in hunting-dog class and have been awarded a CK at the show in question.

The trophy is won outright by the dog owner who has obtained three awards with two different dogs.

The donor has the right to compete for the trophy but may not win it outright.

The trophy was donated by Ulrika Langenius, Pomparnas Kennel, and was established for competition beginning in 2006 at the East Swedish Dachshund Club's autumn show.



Mikkel Muska's Memorial Trophy

The trophy is awarded to the best veteran, regardless of size, coat type, and sex, that at the current show has reached the age of 10 and has received at least Excellent in veteran class.

The trophy is won outright by the dog owner who has won it three times with at least two dogs.

The donor has the right to compete for the trophy but may not win it outright.

The trophy was donated by Ulrika Sillén, Kennel Muskabo, and was established for competition at the East Swedish Dachshund Club's autumn show beginning in 1999.



Bothnia's HPA Tilia Gorthon's Memorial Trophy

The trophy is awarded to the most beautiful long-haired bitch of standard size. To receive an award in the trophy, the bitch must be a blood-tracking and show champion and must have been awarded a CK at the show.

To win the trophy outright, four awards with at least three different bitches are required.

If no bitch meets the qualifications, the trophy is awarded to the best bitch, but without an award being recorded.

The trophy was established by Eva Mindesparr, Bothnia's Kennel, and was awarded for the first time at the East Swedish Dachshund Club's autumn show in 2000.
